

NORTH LINCOLN STREET, KEENE

DIRECTIONS:

From the intersection of North Lincoln Street and Beaver Street: Head north on North Lincoln Street for approx. 0.1 mile. The crossing begins after the last house you encounter on the right-hand (east) side of the road. The crossing ends at the second entrance to the cemetery on the left-hand (west) side of the road.

From the intersection of George Street and North Lincoln Street: Head south on North Lincoln Street for approx. 0.2 mile. The crossing begins at the first entrance to Woodland Cemetery on the right-hand (west) side of the road and ends at the first house you encounter after the cemetery on the left-hand (east) side of the road.

NOTE: This crossing is approx. 0.1 mile long.

OTHER INFO:



North Lincoln Street is for the *frogs*: hundreds of spring peepers and wood frogs cross the road here each spring, compared with only a few dozen spotted salamanders. In 2014, we recorded nearly 2,000 amphibians crossing or attempting to cross North Lincoln Street, and all but 40 of them were frogs!



In 2009, the City of Keene purchased a 7.6-acre parcel of conservation land — previously cleared and slated for development — in the midst of this crossing site. Their decision to protect this land was based in large part on our migratory amphibian data. Even better: starting in 2018, **the City will be closing this site to vehicle traffic on Big Nights!**



PARKING: Park in the southeast section of Woodland Cemetery, near the North Lincoln Street entrance. When North Lincoln Street is closed to traffic, you'll need to access the cemetery via the Beaver Street or Greenlawn entrances. All other entrances will be gated. **Drive carefully** through the cemetery, as frogs hop through there, too.
