

SWANZEY LAKE ROAD, SWANZEY

DIRECTIONS:

From Swanzey Center:

Drive south on Route 32. In about 2 miles, turn right on Swanzey Lake Road. From the center of town, Swanzey Lake Road is the fourth road on the righthand (west) side of Route 32. The crossing begins at the intersection of Route 32 and Swanzey Lake Road, and ends at a private dirt road called Lewis Road, which is the second road on the righthand (west) side of Swanzey Lake Road, if you're coming from Route 32.

NOTE: This crossing is approx. 0.6 mile long.

OTHER INFO:



If you like variety, you'll want to come here! This site has salamanders of all shapes and sizes, including red-backed, four-toed, two-lined, and the charismatic spotted salamander.



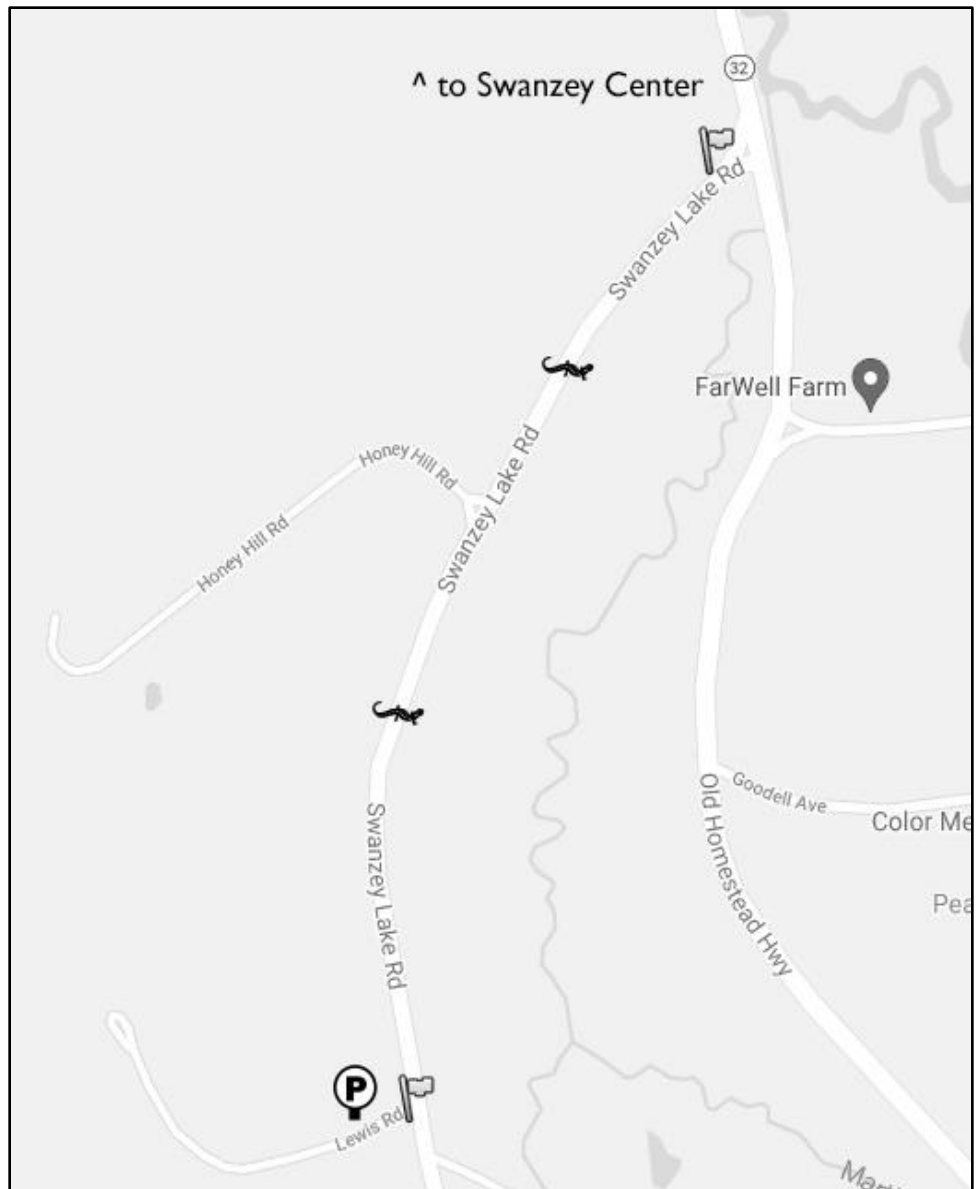
Traffic doesn't tend to be too heavy at this site, but there is a very narrow embankment, so please exercise caution!



Another crossing site exists in the wooded 0.1-mile stretch between 292 and 295 Swanzey Lake Road; please drive carefully if passing through this area. Volunteers are encouraged to stop and help any amphibians they see along the way (safety permitting, of course!)



PARKING: Park along the side of Lewis Road. Please do *not* park on Swanzey Lake Road, as it's easy to slip into the culvert. One year, a volunteer needed to be towed out.
